As the US marked the 15th anniversary of 9/11 last Sunday, a YouTube video was released of a Bible recovered at Ground Zero after the terrorist attacks. The Bible had a particular message to convey. Joel Meyerowitz spent nine months at Ground Zero taking photos in the aftermath of 9/11. A firefighter working there gave him pages from a Bible welded to a piece of steel. Meyerowitz marvelled that the Bible was preserved intact, and even more that it was turned to a passage from Matthew 5:38-39 (KJV) which says, 'Ye have heard that it hath been said, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth: but I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also.' Meyerowitz said, 'Of all the pages in the Bible that it could be opened at, that was remarkable.'

Reuniting refugee children with families

Following Lord Roberts' recent question to the Government about 'what plans they have to speed up the reuniting of refugee children in the camps of Calais and Dunkirk with their families in the United Kingdom', the Archbishop of Canterbury commented: 'The question has been extremely specifically put, about children who have families in this country; this is not about all unaccompanied children.' He also said, 'We are still having continual reports of delays for really quite young children who are not being brought across. Does the Minister not agree that where children - particularly young ones - have families in this country, there is no reason why they should not be brought across within the day?'

Pray: for governments to implement systems quickly to free unaccompanied children from France. (Dt.24:17a)

Controlling behaviour in relationships

The recent Archers storyline on Radio 4 has drawn people's attention to the rise in controlling behaviour in relationships. One of the hardest parts of being a parent is seeing your child hurt in a relationship. It's vital to be aware of the difference between behaviour that is thought of as 'rites of passage' and behaviour which has more serious implications. Pray for organisations such as Women's Aid, Refuge and others who give support and advice to those in or concerned about a situation of controlling behaviour. Pray for the counsellors listening to and advising people around the issues of healthy relationships. Pray for those who recognise a friend or relative being controlled by their partner to take appropriate action. Pray for more specialist training on domestic abuse for all who work in the criminal courts and the family courts. Pray: for those influencing Government by campaigning for social change, and for those in abusive relationships to

Faith schools rules to be relaxed?

The government is set to relax rules on how faith schools select pupils, to allow new Catholic schools to open in England, according to a Number Ten source. It comes as the education secretary said ministers will take a pragmatic look at new grammar schools. Justine Greening said she wanted to offer parents choice but children would not be split into 'winners and losers'. The source said, 'We're going to change the rule, to allow new Catholic schools to open, while making faith schools of all kinds do more to ensure their pupils integrate with children of other backgrounds.' Pray that the furore over reintroduction of grammar schools will not affect the move to remove the cap on faith-based admissions, so that the Catholic Church will be able to meet the current parental demand for thousands of new Catholic school places across the country.

Many in General Synod support LGBT

A letter to the College of Bishops, signed by three deans, eight archdeacons, and 72 members of the House of Laity, states, 'We are keen that the College of Bishops is unequivocal in its acknowledgement that all, including those who identify as LGBT, are essential to the health and future of our church and mission to the wider world.' Synod member and LGBT activist Jayne Ozanne said that the church needs to be seen as a church for all, and bishops can't fudge this any longer. The House of Bishops will meet in November, and is likely to discuss feedback from the recent College of Bishops' meeting. After July's Synod, Andrea Williams of Christian Concern and Wilberforce director Dr Joe Boot issued a statement saying that the paucity of the biblical argument to support anything other than that of the Orthodox and presently-held position had been ignored, and replaced by an appeal to secular norms.

In thirty years over 100 million Bibles have been printed to keep up with global demand. Yet in the UK 90% of people don't read it. One third of 15-year-olds don't know that the nativity story is from the Bible, and the same percentage of adults believe the plot of The Hunger Games is from the Bible. Many people don't think the Bible is relevant to them. The Bible Society is determined to change that, and is working to help people recognise the value of the Bible by developing resources that help local churches to engage more deeply with Scripture. It is sending thousands of volunteers into primary schools to share Bible stories with a generation almost entirely unfamiliar with them. In politics, media and the arts they are bringing the Bible to life in fresh, exciting and relevant ways with a range of activities and resources in both English and Welsh.

European Council meeting today

A European intercessor writes, 'Today the heads of state who make up the European Council will meet in Bratislava (Slovakia holds the EU presidency). IS recruiting desperate jihadists

Many IS terrorists originate from Europe and North America, with recruiters taking advantage of the economically marginalised. In Tunisia, 90% of recruits are from marginalised neighbourhoods. Over half of the Tunisian population is aged under 30, and 40% of them are unemployed. In Jordan, 70% of the population is under 30 and 1/3rd of them are unemployed. It's no coincidence that IS is building networks in marginalised neighbourhoods, towns and refugee camps across Europe - something that Al Qaeda had never even considered. 'The government is not hiring, and no companies are investing', explained a young man. 'We can spend the rest of our lives in limbo or earn a living wage as part of their caliphate.'

Pray: for economically challenged youths to resist the temptation of terrorism. (Mt.6:13)

Syria: tenuous cease-fire starts

The US/Russia-brokered cease-fire for Syria came into effect on Monday and will end at midnight on Sunday. Nations hope the truce can lead to the revival of peace talks between Assad's government and the rebels battling to overthrow him and contribute to efforts to defeat IS and other extremists in Syria. Russia's Deputy Foreign Minister Mikhail Bogdanov said peace talks between opposition groups and the government could resume as early as next month. However, that scenario is complicated by the fact that Jabhat Fateh al-Sham remains intertwined with several other groups who are fighting on the ground and harshly criticised the US/Russian agreement to reduce violence. However, it did not reject the ceasefire, and along with the 21 insurgent groups welcomed plans to deliver aid to besieged areas of the northern city of Aleppo, saying it will help facilitate them. Pray for peaceful strategic military objectives to be achieved, with ongoing UN-established aid corridors into areas.

Pray: for this to be the beginning of the end of civilian massacres. (Nu.6:26)

Global famine report - 30 August 2016

The nutrition situation in Borno and Yobe states in NIGERIA is extreme. The Boko Haram conflict has contributed to large-scale population displacement, limiting market activity, and restricting normal livelihoods. Other areas of highest concern are ETHIOPIA: following a severe drought, more people will need food assistance over the coming year than at any time in the past ten years. SUDAN: below-average national food production and very large pasture deficits. SOUTH SUDAN: conflicts continue to disrupt trade, humanitarian access, and livelihoods. Food security has deteriorated to 'Emergency' in Northern Bahr el Ghazal. YEMEN: extensive conflict has reduced incomes and elevated food prices. Food is inadequate for poor households. Many are suffering from the 2015/16 El Niño which led to drought. SOUTHERN AFRICA: 2016 is a second poor food production year. The number of people in crisis is expected to continue to increase through the year. HAITI: there are below-average agricultural seasons, reduced labour demand, and continuing high staple food prices.

Pray: for those experiencing food price increases, and the millions of hungry displaced populations. (Is.51:4b)

Iraq: tragedy for Christians

IS has spread from Syria to Iraq; giving Christians the ultimatum - convert, submit, or die. In Basra and Baghdad Christian women are threatened in the workplace and forced to wear headscarves. Many have been driven out. There is low-level persecution of Christians by the government and its Shia-dominated army. Kidnapping is commonplace. 'The future looks bleak for Christians in Iraq,' says Paul Robinson of Release, 'Christians are caught in the crossfire.' The'ar and his family fled from Baghdad to the Christian village of Qaraqosh, but had to flee again when it was captured by IS. The'ar said, 'We have no future. Our prayer is to leave this country, just to be human and to raise our kids with dignity.' However, there are rays of light. Thousands of refugees have trekked through the desert to Kurdistan, which has declared itself a safe haven for Christian refugees. It is one of the few areas of the Middle East where churches for Muslim-background believers are flourishing.

Pray: for more safe havens for Muslim-background Christians, for the Christian faith to survive and thrive, and for

Christian refugees to be given the same aid and treatment as others. (Job 11:18)

Thailand: Pakistani Christians are unwanted

New rules regarding the UNHCR process have been decried by Christian advocates in Thailand, who claim that the change in rules disproportionately target Pakistani Christian refugees. Fleeing persecution in th homeland, eir Pakistani Christians comprise the largest portion of the refugee community in Thailand. Thai authorities often view these refugees as illegal immigrants, round them up, and detain them in deplorable conditions. On their arrival in Thailand they soon discover they are unwanted when their travel visa expires and they apply for asylum at the UNHCR. Here they are advised that despite having an official UN asylum registration, Thailand's refusal to sign UN conventions on asylum means that their status is illegal. Will pressure from the international community help change the UNHCR process for the better, or will the situation for Pakistani Christian refugees continue to get worse?

Pray: for the thousand or more Pakistani Christians in Thailand arrested and detained in brutal detention centres in Bangkok where cell cramming, starvation and infection are debilitating them. (Ps.20:2)

Israel: 'Study the Bible', says Netanyahu

At a cabinet meeting ahead of the new school year, Benjamin Netanyahu urged students to study the Bible and their Jewish heritage. 'Our objective is to carry out an education revolution,' he said. 'This will be based on two things: excellence and Zionism. Excellence, to enable every child to realise their potential, and Zionism, based on the study of the Bible and Jewish heritage, to understand why the Jews are in Israel. First of all, the study of the Bible. We must make a major effort this is the basis for why we are here, why we have returned here, why we stay here.' Education Minister Naftali said, 'We need to highlight our national values, Zionism, love of country and service to the state, and the strengthening of our shared Jewish roots. Knowledge is a critical word.'

Pray: for every child - Jewish, non-Jewish, and secular - to read the New Testament and be blessed. (Eph.3:18)

■ Iraq: new UN goodwill ambassador

A young Yazidi woman who survived trafficking and gang-rape by IS is to be appointed a UN ambassador. Nadia Murad, who is also a Nobel Peace Prize nominee, will become the UNODC goodwill ambassador for the Dignity of Survivors of Human Trafficking. Her appointment marks the first time a survivor of atrocities has been given this distinction. Ms Murad was captured in Iraq in 2014. Six of her brothers were murdered. The 23-year-old told the BBC she had also been subjected to sexual and physical abuse, including being gang-raped, but managed to escape. Since then she has been advocating for the end of human trafficking. Her ambassadorship 'will focus on advocacy initiatives and raise awareness around the plight of the countless victims of trafficking in persons, especially refugees, women and girls', the UN said.

Pray: for all the women who have been similarly abused, and for those seeking to help and counsel them. (Jer.22:3)
